Meeting National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

Priority should always be given to ensuring that pupils can perform safe self-rescue even if they do not fully meet the first two requirements of the National Curriculum programme of study

<u>Question</u>	<u>Stats:</u>	<u>Further context</u> <u>Relative to local challenges</u>
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	46%	16 children not competent and confident. 5 children of which are non swimmers, and whilst have gained in confidence in water, are not comfortable enough. 11 children are able to perform strokes, but not for sustained period/lengths required. 2 children have missed multiple swimming lessons due to poor attendance, reluctant or fear of swimming.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	46%	
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	43%	12 out of 28 children.

If your schools swimming data is below national expectation, you can choose to use the Primary PE and sport premium to provide additional top-up sessions for those pupils that did not meet National Curriculum requirements after the completion of core lessons. Have you done this?		Yes. Children identified last year as requiring additional support with their swimming have had their swimming sessions provided for them from the PE premium.
Have you provided CPD to improve the knowledge and confidence of staff to be able to teach swimming and water safety?		Swimming is taught by an external certified provider, so school staff CPD is not required.
